

Fitness Center July Closure

The School District of Manawa hopes you are enjoying your Fitness Center membership and the conveniences of a location to exercise right here in town. We appreciate your patronage!

We want to alert you to the fact that the Fitness Center will be closed to the public for the month of July. Fitness Center fobs will be turned off during July. Watch for reopening information on the SDM's website and social media. To compensate patrons for the inconvenience, next year's membership fee will be prorated to 11 months (one free month).

The Manawa Middle School/Little Wolf High School paving project will begin immediately following summer school and is anticipated to extend until mid-August. SUMMER READING PROGRAMIUNDERWAY

Sturm Memorial Library's summer reading program, "Tails & Tales," began June 7 and runs through July 30.

The eight-week program includes reading, special weekly activities and virtual and in-person programs. The program is open to all ages, including adults. Anyone wishing to participate can download the BeanstackTM app or go to manawalibrary.beanstack.org and set up an account and get started.

Parents can set up accounts for each child and easily track reading and program progress in the app. New to the program this year is a community-wide reading challenge to reach 1,000 books collectively. While this sounds like a lot, the more people that sign up and enter the challenge, the easier the goal will be.

BeanstackTM awards badges as you read, do activities and attend programs. Each badge then translates into a virtual drawing slips for prize baskets in four different age groups. Library staff are excited to be able to offer BeanstackTM again this summer, courtesy of funding from the state of Wisconsin.
