<p>APUSH Exam Review-APUSH Period 1-7</p>	<p>Through the 1st new APUSH Exam date (May 15), the course will be reviewing for the APUSH National Exam. This will consist of reviewing the Vocabulary needed and the concept of a DBQ, which the Exam will be scored on. The class will focus on the time periods that the DBQ is eligible to be from, this includes Period 1 (1491-1607), Period 2 (16-7-1754), Period 3 (1754-1800), Period 4 (1800-1848), Period 5 (1844-1877), Period 6 (1865-1898), and Period 7 (1890-1945). Periods 8 (1945-1908) and Period 9 (1980-Present) will not be on the revamped Exam, and will not be assigned content. Lessons on Periods 8 and 9 will be created by the teacher and offered but will be optional for students.</p>
<p>THEME 1: AMERICAN AND NATIONAL IDENTITY (NAT) This theme focuses on how and why definitions of American and national identity and values have developed among the diverse and changing population of North America as well as on related topics, such as citizenship, constitutionalism, foreign policy, assimilation, and American exceptionalism.</p>	<p>When the Exam date has passed, the remainder of the Course will be working on a final project that gives the students numerous options in terms of content and construction. The topics are all centered on APUSH Theme 1: American and National Identity. Students could work with political topics but also the chance to work with "pop culture" topics, which are certainly a part of our national identity as well.</p>
