Fines & Fees

Damaged Materials

When materials are returned in a damaged condition but are repairable, they will be assessed for damage and a fine will be given to cover the cost of repair. If materials are damaged beyond repair then the full cost of the material's replacement will be charged.

Lost Materials

When materials are lost, students will be charged for the replacement of the materials. If the item is found and returned to the library within the school year, a refund of the paid replacement cost will be made.

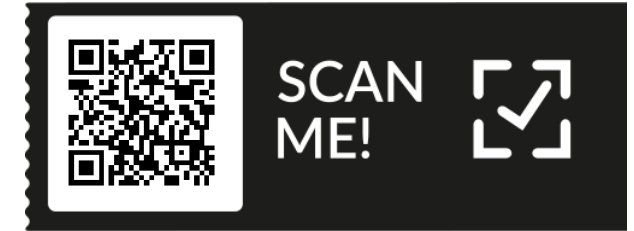

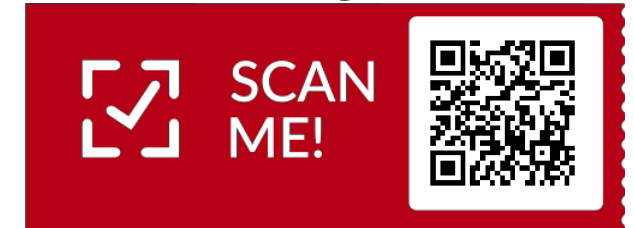
